

Be a Monarchist! Save the Butterflies.

November in North Central Texas tends to have an abundance of orange and black (and not just for Halloween decorations) found in the fluttering wings of Monarch butterflies as they pass through on their annual Fall Migration to Mexico. Sadly, scientists estimate that 6 out of every 10 Monarch butterflies die from starvation en route to their Winter nesting grounds due to the loss of native habitat and native wildflowers that produce sustaining nectar. The best way to help the butterflies is to plant wildflowers native to your specific area. Monarchs in particular LOVE the milkweed flower, and there are many varieties. One of the best resources for native plants comes from the eponymous Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center; it is through the efforts of the late First Lady of Texas and later the United States that so many Texas roadsides were seeded with wildflowers in an attempt to restore some of the state's natural plants and beauty.

THE AMON CARTER MUSEUM OF AMERICAN ART

2017 has been a phenomenal year for the Amon Carter Museum of American Art. They began the year with the announcement that they were receiving a \$20,000,000 USD endowment, and they just recently announced they'd also received a \$150,000 USD photography grant. These funds will help the museum

and open to the public.

You can rest assured that one of several exhibits they currently have, *Caught on Paper*, is on my must see list. "Caught on Paper brings together more than thirty works on paper from the Amon Carter's permanent collection. With watercolors and prints by artists such as Winslow Homer, Frederic Remington, Charles M. Russell, Arthur Fitzwilliam Tait, and Eliot Porter, this show is truly a rare catch." One of my other must see exhibits is from Japanese artist Yayoi Kusama and her "All the Eternal Love I have for the Pumpkins". She creates art installations that immerse and surround the viewer in an environment that is fantastical, bold, and full of whimsy.
